Care Package Event Checklist

Planning for success with more rigorous customs requirements from Custom and Border Protection and USPS (updated September 2025):



Note: USPS prohibits mailing hand sanitizer, aerosols, itms with alcohol, and other hazardous materials,

Preplanning

- 1. Set your date and find your space
- 2. Collect address (s)
 - Check each zip code for base-specific restrictions
 - Group recipient's by like items / zip code restrictions

3. Standardize donations and set deadlines

- · Decide what you will pack and determine quantities
- Aim for consistency: Items, sizes, quantities to simplify
- Capture what you need for each item in advance

4. Create your donation lists / links and share

- · Consider Amazon list, donation link, etc.
- Explain to donors that specific items simplifies customs compliance.
- 5. Reassess and check in -1 to 3 weeks prior to packing
 - Order any additional items needed
 - Make sure you have enough paper or labels (multiple labels per box are likely)

Packing Plan

- 1. **Create your labels** (Ship Thrifty allows you to save labels, do customs ahead of time, and copy labels and customs for the same or different people)
 - Reminder you may have multiple labels per box multiples must be kept with the original (it goes with the tracking number so sort and separate carefully)
 - Make sure you have enough labels (or paper) to print the labels and customs continuation forms
 - Plan for package pickup or drop off (fill out the USPS pickup form if you want them to pickup)

2. Prepare your space

- Setup tables (clearly separate items and write down how many should go in each box)
- Talk with volunteers about the process (adding extra items can cause non-refundable returns)
- Thank people for donations but remove random ones from the packing space
- Put designated volunteers on label duty (be sure they know to keep them in order with the original label if multiples)
- · Celebrate and clean up

Customs Compliance is Mandatory

As of 9/1/25 each item will require:

- Detailed Description
- HS Code
- Ouantity
- Weight
- Country of Origin

NEW SHIPPING RULES FOR PACKAGES WITH APO/FPO ADDRESSES

Effective September 1, 2025 there are new rules for completing the custom forms if you are mailing packages out of the U.S., that includes APO and FPO addresses.

Each package will need a detailed customs form filled out, it can NO LONGER BE HAND WRITTEN. You will need to have for each item in the package a detailed description of the item, its tariff code, the weight of each individual item, the cost of each individual item, how many of each item and the country of origin or the item i.e. where was it made. You will need to bring the list of this information to the post office so the postal clerk can enter the information electronically to produce the custom form. The postal clerk WILL NOT look up the individual tariff codes for you. This on-line site can be used to look up tariff codes https://hts.usitc.gov/ For example the tariff code for a toothbrush is 9603.21.00.00, shampoo is 3305.10.00, cookies is 1905.31.00. Keep in mind you will need to do research also on where the item came from. Also keep in mind though the packages to our service members stay within the military postal system you need to be aware of the restrictions for items going into foreign countries. The USPS lists the restrictions by country on this website https:// www.usps.com/international/shipping-restrictions.htm Please be aware of these restrictions as you do not want your service member getting in trouble for items you should not be sending.

Eagle Star Housing

Eagle Star Housing will be opening a new housing facility for veterans in Rochester. Eagle Star House has been helping veterans and individuals experiencing housing instability be-



come self-sufficient in Upstate New York since 2012. The Permanent Supportive Apartment Program will offer 42 supportive and affordable apartments for Veterans experiencing housing instability. On-site supportive services will be provided by full-time Eagle Star Housing staff Services will include: Rental Subsidy, Fully furnished apartment, Case management, Individual and group meetings, Support obtaining employment and/or further job training, Linkages to community resources, income and health insurance, and Life skills and budgeting groups. Transportation assistance for appointments. Regular activities, including game and movie nights, are organized by Eagle Star Housing staff.
